OFFICIAL BULLETIN No. 41

February presents an excellent opportunity for every amateur to test his frequency measuring skill by taking part in an ARRL Frequency Measuring Test. W1AW will transmit signals for measurement on Feb. 11 at 0230 and 0530 GMT. This will be the evening of Feb. 10 at 2130 EST on approximately 3514, 7060 and 14,086 kc. A second series of test signals will be transmitted three hours later on about 3524, 7086 and 14,147 kc. Each participant will receive an individual report comparing the accuracy of his measurements with those of a professional frequency measuring laboratory. Further FMT details will appear on page 94 of Feb. QST.

OFFICIAL BULLETIN No. 40

Attention DXers. K1YPE/XV5 is now operating from Viet Nam with the express authority of the local government. FCC, therefore, will have no objection to United States amateurs working this station within the framwork permitted by the Viet Nam authorities. Additionally, FCC has forwarded information stating that K1YPE/XV5 has received permission to handle third party traffic.

OFFICIAL BULLETIN No. 34
A reciprocal operating agreement becomes effective Nov. 28 between the United States and Colombia. Amateurs of one country visiting or residing in the other may obtain permission to operate their own amateur stations there. The United States has previously reached such agreements with Australia, Belgium, Bolivia, Canada, Costa Rica, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Luxembourg, Peru Portugal and Sierra Leone. Many others are being negotiated and successes will be announced as they occur.

Attention DXers. Announcement is hereby made of the addition to the ARRL Countries List of the Spratly Islands. Located in the South China Sea approximately 775 miles northeast of Singapore, Spratly Islands is territory with historic claims by four different countries but territory in the possession of no one country.
